# **WISCONSIN FREIGHT RAILROADS AND LABOR**

- 3,669 freight railroad employees in Wisconsin. Most of these employees belong to a union.
- \$228 million in annual Wisconsin wages and benefits (2002).
- Among nation's most highly-compensated workers. Average Class 1 employee in 2002



#### ENVIRONMENT TODAY'S CLASS I FREIGHT RAIL


- Vast majority privately-owned.

#### CRUCIAL **CAPITAL - RETURN ON INVESTMENT IS** RAILROADS DO NOT EARN THEIR COST OF

If ROI > cost of capital:

- Capital spending expands
- Stronger physical plant
- Faster, more reliable service
- Sustainability



- Lower capital spending
- Weaker physical plant
- Slower, less reliable service
- Disinvestment

#### **IMPROVEMENTS** FOR SOME FREIGHT RAIL INFRASTRUCTURE PUBLIC/PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS NEEDED

Freight Rail Provides Public Benefits:

- Fuel Efficient
- Less Pollution
- Reduced Highway Congestion
- Safer

#### PARTNERSHIPS/INFRASTRUCTURE PUBLIC/PRIVATE

- Chicago Gateway affects Wisconsin shippers
- CREATE = multi-modal program of freight rail, improvement projects passenger rail and highway-related capital
- All partners agreed on project
- Federal, state and railroad funds

#### IMPROVEMENT RELATED TO INFRASTRUCTURE RAIL SAFETY: DRAMATIC IMPROVEMENT

• Accidents per million ton miles:

**REDUCED: 64% since 1980** 

12% since 1990

Injuries & illness per 100 employees: REDUCED: 71% since 1980

57% since 1990

Loss & damage as % of revenue: REDUCED

#### MAJOR SAFETY CONCERN HIGHWAY-RAIL GRADE CROSSINGS ARE A

- Highway safety issues
- Wisconsin establishes priorities
- About 6,000 in Wisconsin, some need to be closed
- Section 130 federal funds, Operation Lifesaver
- Railroads spend approximately \$5,000 annually on signalized crossings

- Currently does not cover the public benefits
