

**Transfer Students: 2006-07** 

#### UW System Transfer Student Enrollment 1997-98 to 2006-07



#### **Highlights**

#### **Transfer Student Enrollment in 2006-07**

- 15,526 students transferred into or within the UW System in 2006-07.
- Of these transfer students, 13,554 (87%) were new transfer students and 1,972 (13%) were re-entry transfer students.
- 41% of new transfer students were from within the UW System, 29% from out-of-state institutions, 21% from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges, and the remainder from Wisconsin private or international institutions.

#### **New Transfer Student Demographics in Fall 2006**

- 26% of new transfer students entered as freshmen, 39% as sophomores, and 35% as upperclassmen.
- 86% of new transfer students were full-time students.
- 57% of new transfer students were between the age of 20 and 24.
- 52% of new transfer students were female.
- 9% of new transfer students were students of color.

#### **New Transfer Student Outcomes**

- The first year GPA of fall 2006 new transfer students was 2.9.
- The second year retention rate of fall 2005 new transfer students was 72%.
- The six-year graduation rate of fall 2000 new transfer students was 57%.



Of these transfer students, 13,554 were new transfer students and 1,972 were re-entry transfer students. New transfer students are students who have not previously enrolled at the institution to which they transferred. Re-entry transfer students are students re-enrolling at a UW institution with transfer credits. During the last five years, new transfer student enrollments fluctuated with the largest enrollment in 2004-05, while re-entry transfer student enrollments fluctuated with the largest enrollment in 2003-04 (Figure 1).

Students transfer between UW institutions, from Wisconsin Technical Colleges, from Wisconsin-based private colleges and universities, from out-of-state institutions (colleges and universities located in other states), and from international institutions (colleges and universities outside the United States). Appendix A and B show the details on new transfer students and re-entry transfer students to the UW System by sending institution (the last college or university from which the student transferred) from 2002-03 to 2006-07. Appendix C and D show the details on new transfer students and re-entry transfer students to the UW System by sending institution and receiving institution (the UW institution to which they transferred) in 2006-07.

Out of 15,526 transfer students in 2006-07, 13,554 (87%) were new transfer students. The remainder of this report focuses on new transfer students only. Figure 2 illustrates the proportion of new transfer students into or within the UW System in 2006-07 by type of sending institution. Intra-UW System transfers (41%) were the largest source of new transfer students for UW institutions. The Intra-UW System transfer group includes transfers among UW 4-Year institutions, transfers from UW Colleges to UW 4-Year institutions, and transfers from UW 4-Year institutions to UW Colleges. The second largest share of new transfers into the UW System, 29 percent, came from out-of-state institutions. New transfer students from the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) constituted 21 percent of the total new transfer population. Seven percent (7%) of students transferred from Wisconsin private institutions, while a small percentage (2%) of students transferred from international institutions.

More than half of the students transferring from out-of-state institutions were Wisconsin residents (55% in 2006-07 or 2,174 students). Of these Wisconsin residents, 33 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Minnesota, 10 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Illinois, and 7 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Michigan. Originating institutions sending the most Wisconsin resident transfer students to the UW System in 2006-07 were the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities (251 students), Winona State University (100 students), and Northern Michigan University (51 students).

Of the 260 new transfer students from international institutions in 2006-07, 56 (22%) were Wisconsin residents.




by Type of Sending Institution


New transfer student enrollments at the UW System increased from 13,289 in 2005-06 to 13,554 in 2006-07. This slight increase (265) was mainly driven by the increase in new transfers from UW 4-Year institutions (196), the Wisconsin Technical Colleges (120), and Wisconsin private institutions (73). New transfers from out-of-state institutions decreased by 128 from 2005-06 to 2006-07 (Figure 3).

From 2002-03 to 2006-07, the percentage of new transfers to the UW System from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges increased slightly, while the percentage from UW 4-Year institutions decreased slightly. New transfer students from international institutions remained at about 2 percent. For the other three types of sending institutions, UW Colleges, Wisconsin private institutions, and out-of-state institutions, the proportion fluctuated over the last five years (Figure 4).



Two-thirds of new transfer students begin in the fall term while the remaining third begin in the summer or spring term. This section focuses on new transfer students who entered in the fall semester of academic year 2006-07 and the characteristics of these students during the semester that they transferred.

Figure 5 shows the distribution of the fall 2006 new transfer cohort by student classification. Student classification is based on the total number of credits which transferred from one or more transfer institutions. Overall, 26 percent of new transfer students entered at the freshman level, but this percentage varied depending on the type of sending institution. Twelve percent (12%) of new transfer students from UW Colleges and international institutions entered as freshmen, compared to 48 percent from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges. Appendix E provides details on the distribution of the fall 2006 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution and student classification.

The majority of new transfers (86%) were full-time students, with a credit load of 12 or more credits (Figure 6). A larger proportion of transfers from Wisconsin Technical Colleges entered the UW System as part-time students. Seventy-six percent (76%) of new transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges entered as full-time students, compared to 89 percent from both UW Colleges and UW 4-Year institutions. by Type of Sending Institution and Full-Time/Part-Time Status







Figure 7 shows the age distribution of the fall 2006 new transfer cohort. The majority (57%) of new transfer students were between ages 20 and 24. This percentage ranged from 47 percent from Wisconsin private institutions to 71 percent from UW Colleges. Thirty percent (30%) of new transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges were 25 years old and over, compared to 10 percent from UW 4-Year institutions.





Overall, 52 percent of the fall 2006 new transfer cohort were female and 48 percent were male (Figure 8). Forty-nine percent (49%) of new transfer students from UW Colleges were female, compared to 57 percent from Wisconsin private institutions.

In the fall 2006 new transfer cohort, fewer than 10 percent of the students were students of color (Figure 9). Five percent (5%) of new transfer students from UW Colleges were students of color, compared to 15 percent from Wisconsin private institutions. 

#### **NEW TRANSFER STUDENT OUTCOMES**

Figure 10 shows the first year grade point averages (GPA) for fall 2004, 2005, and 2006 new transfer students. This GPA reflects the courses that the new transfer students completed during their first year at the transfer institution. The average first year GPA of fall 2006 new transfer students was 2.9 on a 4.0 scale. This can be compared to the average first year GPA of all new freshmen who entered the UW System in fall 2006 which was also 2.9. There has been little change in the average first year GPA for the past three cohorts of fall new transfer entrants. Appendix H details the average first year GPAs of the fall 2004, 2005, and 2006 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution.



Fall 2004 to Fall 2006




Another measure of success for new students is second year retention rate; that is, students successfully complete their first year and return to the same institution for a second year of study. Of the new transfer students who entered in fall 2005, 72 percent returned in fall 2006. Figure 11 shows that the first to second year retention rates for fall 2003, 2004, and 2005 new transfer students varied by type of sending institution. Fall 2005 new transfer students from UW Colleges had the highest second year retention rate (80%), while those from Wisconsin private institutions had the lowest second year retention rate (61%). These rates can be compared to the second year retention rate of 80 percent for all students who entered the UW System in fall 2005 as full-time new freshmen.

Fall 2003 to Fall 2005




Students who transfer as freshmen are retained at substantially lower rates than students who transfer as sophomores or upperclassmen (Figure 12). Overall, students who transferred at the freshman level in fall 2005 had a 61 percent second year retention rate while students who transferred as sophomores or upperclassmen had a 75 percent and 76 percent retention rate, respectively. However, these rates varied by type of sending institution. For example, second year retention rates ranged from a 69 percent retention rate for UW Colleges freshman transfers to a 45 percent retention rate for freshman transfers from Wisconsin private institutions. Appendix I provides details on the second year retention rates for the fall 2005 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution.

Fall 2005




Six-year graduation rates also provide a measure of success for transfer students. Figure 13 shows six-year graduation rates at any UW institution for fall 1998, 1999, and 2000 new transfers by type of sending institution. These rates have improved over time for all types of sending institutions, with the exception of UW 4-Year institutions which have remained steady. Fall 2000 new transfers from UW Colleges had the highest six-year graduation rate (70%), followed by fall 2000 new transfers from UW 4-Year institutions (64%).

Overall, students who transfer as upperclassmen or sophomores have higher graduation rates than students who transfer as freshmen. For students who transferred at the sophomore level, six-year graduation rates ranged from 73 percent for fall 2000 new transfers from UW 4-Year institutions to 52 percent for fall 2000 new transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges (Figure 14). For comparison purposes, the six-year graduation rate for all students who entered the UW System in fall 2000 as full-time new freshmen was 64 percent.
