Changes needed to adopt Missouri Model:

Pay for medical and treatment services through federally-funded or state-only Medicaid, and educational services via state school aids.

- 1. State-only and federally-reimbursed Medicaid
 - Determine standards for federally-reimbursable settings for Medicaid purposes, for example what degree of physical security is allowable.
 - Establish a state-only Medicaid eligibility category for youth in secure settings that are not eligible for federal funding.
- 2. State school funds
 - Add WI-DJC schools to state school aids and determine a funding formula as well as whether aids would be received from DPI or from a youth's school district.
 - If 100% of education costs were funded by GPR, as is the case for state-run schools such as the School for the Blind, the daily rate would decrease by \$30.47. If 2/3 of education costs were funded through GPR, as is the case for local public schools, this would remove \$4.34 million, or \$20.41 from the daily rate.
 - For an estimated 570 students, annual funding could be \$3.1 million (\$14.58 of daily rate) if based on WI-DPI 2008-09 average per-student equalization aids.
