Additional Grant Activities

- The first annual "U Hafta FAFSA" campaign ran from November through mid-February and included information and professional development for school counselors, print materials for students, and hands-on FAFSA assistance for students and families. The culmination of the campaign, FAFSA Week, was officially proclaimed by Governor Jim Doyle and included over 55 FAFSA completion events with more than 470 attendees.
- The Wisconsin College Access Challenge Grant once again supported the Wisconsin College Goal Sunday Weekend Edition events for 2010. There were 25 events held across the state with 2,725 attendees, an 18% increase in attendance over the 2009 events.
- Replication of the UW-Green Bay Phuture Phoenix program was completed successfull at the UW-Eau Claire campus. The UW-Eau Claire Blugold Beginnings program replicated the college course and in-school mentoring program and hosted the signature field trip days for area fifth graders on May 4 and 5.
