








Human Burial Sites Preservation: Some History



Burial Program Authority

- 1986 Wisconsin Act 316
- Wisconsin Statute § 157.70
- Wisconsin Administrative Code § HS 1
- Wisconsin Administrative Code § HS 2
- Wisconsin Statutes § 70.11 (13)



Structure of the Board

- 9 members:
 - WHS: State Archaeologist, State
 Historic Preservation Officer, Director
 - Tribal: 3 from federally recognized tribes or bands in Wisconsin
 - Archaeology: 3 members in fields of archaeology, physical anthropology, history or related field



Duties of Burial Board

- Hears quasi-judicial appeals of Director or ALJ permit & disposition decisions
- Reviews applications to Registry of Interested Persons
- Requests AG or local DA investigation of burial law violations

- Approves sales/trades of publicly-owned burial sites
- Considers policies related to burial matters
- Meets at least quarterly


What is a Human Burial Site?

Any place where human remains are

- Intentionally interred
- Accidentally buried
- But not exposed on the surface




Burial Sites in Wisconsin



- 9682 recorded
 burial sites (3,109
 are mounds)
- 1,421 are catalogued (930 cemeteries, 491 mounds
- 30,000 mounds once in Wisc, now about 4,000



How Do We Catalogue a Site?

- We get a call . . .
- Conduct research
- Talk to owner
 - Visit site, confirm it
 - Attempt to convince owner to catalogue site
 - Explain sacred nature, tax advantages
 - Explain benefits of catalogued and uncatalogued
 - Explain processes to disturb




Requirements to Catalogue

Sufficient Information to locate site

- Agreement of landowner
- Afforded statutory protection



- Notification of registry
- Decision
- Appeal




Statutory Priority Ranking of Registrants' Interests

- Direct kinship
- Cultural, tribal or religious affiliation
- Scientific, environmental or educational interest
- Historical & aesthetic significance of the site
- Land use


- Commercial purpose unrelated to land use & consistent with the purposes of the law
- Any other interest director deems to be in the public interest

Appellate Process Options





Uncatalogued Burial Site






Unnamed Burial Site Jefferson County

Disposition

- Registry Notification/Solicitation
- Registry Application(s)
- Director Determination
- Review (if necessary)




Proposed Modifications

- Create or authorize Native American organization to determine disposition of Native remains
- Clarify or expand definitions including: burial site, human remains, analysis, registry of interested persons
- Include time-frames for review process steps in the law



Burial Sites in Wisconsin






Highway Construction

Home Construction














Burial Disturbance Projects in Wisconsin
