Organizers hope to complete by this fall improvements to the cemetery for 133 people who died in Outagamie County's long-shuttered asylum for the chronic insane.

## Project brings dignity to insane asylum cemetery

**GRAND CHUTE** — The idea was simple: Bring a touch of dignity to a tucked-away, barren cemetery that lacked reminders of its dead.

But it's been a far more exhaustive project than any of its organizers could have imagined.

The Outagamie County Cemetery is the final resting place for 133 people who died while confined at its former asylum for the chronic insane. Supporters of the project figured it would take about six months to complete.

That was two years ago.

"We were all pretty naive," said Mary Robertson, a lead organizer.

Still, leaders say today that their enthusiasm hasn't waned, and they anticipate work will be done at the cemetery this summer. They will add a granite memorial stone listing the names of those who are interred at the site, as well as a trail on its edge, a pergola and a granite bench.

Organizers can't begin the project, however, until the Wisconsin Historical Society approves the land survey and site plan. They're confident that will happen.

The county's cemetery oversight committee and a larger group of supporters — Friends of Outagamie County Cemetery — hope to have a dedication ceremony in early fall.

In one sense, they can already claim success. Their goal was to shine light on the forgotten, and they've achieved it.

For many years, the site was littered and grown over. The cemetery is now maintained, but it has become more of a curiosity than a place of reverence. That's changing.

The metal, road-type sign identifying the grounds carried a misspelling of the word "cemetery." The county's highway department recently fixed that error, even though the sign will be removed in a matter of months.

The asylum was opened in 1889, along with a farm that provided work to those who were confined there. The farm closed long ago and the asylum building was razed. Brewster Village, the county's nursing home, stands near the site of the former asylum.

Gwen Zimmerman was among those who ignited the project. She's found meaning in the many steps and requirements they've worked through along the way. The same level of detail is required as it would be for those planning changes at any of the larger, adorned and manicured cemeteries.

"It's something these individuals are deserving of," Zimmerman said.

Steve Seim, a Beaver Dam man who has researched the state's institutional cemeteries for several years, praised Outagamie County's efforts while noting that many similar county cemeteries are in rough shape. The Outagamie County project speaks to important shifts in our society, Seim said.

"(The asylum) was a way to deal with them; to get them out of the way and often they were forgotten in their own lifetimes," Seim said. "When we don't maintain the cemeteries, they're forgotten to history, as well."

On April 29, 1986, the Wisconsin Legislature passed into law 1985 Wisconsin Act 316, (known as 157.70 *Wis. Stats.*) which revised previous, and created new legislation relating to the preservation of all prehistoric, historic, and contemporary human burial sites. Under the provisions of this statute the Director of the State Historical Society is directed to identify and record in a catalogue, burial sites in the state along with sufficient contiguous land necessary to protect the burial site from disturbance.

The Director is also instructed to cause a catalogued burial site to be recorded by the Register of Deeds if the county in which the burial site is located. Once a site is catalogued, the law provides a property tax exemption for the portion of land on which a burial site is located. This ensures that the property tax treatment for burial sites will be consistent with the present property tax treatment for cemeteries. No person may intentionally cause or permit the disturbance of a catalogued burial site without a permit from the Director of the State Historical Society.

**NOTICE OF LOCATION OF CATALOGUED BURIAL SITE**

WHEREAS, the legislature intends by 1985 Wisconsin Act 316 to assure that all human burials be accorded equal treatment and respect for human dignity without reference to ethnic origins, cultural backgrounds or religious affiliations; and

WHEREAS, s. 157.70(2)(a), Wis. Stats. Provides that the director of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin shall identify and record in a catalog, burial sites in this state, together with sufficient contiguous land necessary to protect the burial site from disturbance; and

WHEREAS, s. 7011(13), Wis. Stats. Provides a property tax exemption for land containing a burial site which is entered in the state catalog of burial sites and that this makes the property tax treatment of burial sites consistent with the property tax treatment of cemeteries; and

WHEREAS, s. 157.70(5)(b), Wis. Stats. Provides that no person may intentionally cause or permit the disturbance of a cataloged burial site without a permit from the director of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

The excavation will destroy a 1.87 acre wetland adjacent to the tributary. In addition, a 50 foot long water control structure will be placed across this stream to divert runoff into the basin during storm events.

**AREA AND TYPES OF WATERS (including wetlands) SUBJECT TO LOSS:** Approximately 1.87 acres of wet meadow wetland will be lost as a result of the excavation of this detention basin. The wetland receives water from the adjacent stream during flood events and provides habitat to small mammals and birds.

**MITIGATION:** The applicant proposes to compensate for the values and functions lost as a result of this proposal by enlarging an existing wetland area on another tributary to Mud Creek approximately 2 miles north of the proposed detention pond. The applicant proposes to excavate 1.88 acres of fallow upland adjacent to a existing wetland. The excavation will be 6 inches below the proposed final grade. This will allow the placement of 6 inches of hydric soils obtained from the wetland that will be destroyed. The combination of the excavation, hydric soils and associated seedbank should allow the wetland to develop characteristics similar to the original wetland area. By siting the mitigation adjacent to an existing wetland, hydrology, animal usage, and plant communities should be similar. The applicant will monitor the site for a period of two years after the growing season that the construction is completed. A letter report will be forwarded to the Corps of Engineers by December 31 of each of these two years.

If not, I will pursue filling out the form right away and share it with Outagamie County.

Thank you for your response! I am thrilled to share with you the list of those who were buried at the Outagamie County Cemetery. I will also get out to take photos as soon as the snow is gone and send them to you as well.

I would be happy to update the form for you. And for your information, I will share with you our program document showing the proposed phases and the work we are planning to do. We have a committee meeting next week where I will share the program document with the committee. I need a few details from the rest of the committee to complete it.

I do want to ask for your advice. We are all concerned that in time when we are all gone or moved away, will the cemetery be taken care of. At the moment awareness has been raised about the cemetery being neglected and we are all concerned that it could happen again. I have looked over the documents for the Historical Site and wondered if we should pursue having it designated as a Registered Historical Site. Would that preserve it and would it be protected and maintained if we did that?

It is on Outagamie County land, and the county will always own the land. Adjacent to it on the north and east lot line, and dangerously close, the Technical College has their truck driving school. The town of Grand Chute dug a large detention pond on the west side of the cemetery dangerously close too. The town does not want to maintain it. The county didn't maintain it. In 2007 when the cemetery made the news to repair it the Technical College said they would mow it. And they have done so since 2007. I am just afraid that if the maintenance crew retires or leaves their job that it could fall into an overgrown weed bed as it was back before 2007.

So can you advise me as to what steps we as a committee should pursue to assure proper maintenance for its future? I am willing to work on any application process and follow through with the proper paperwork.

We also have a local resident who lived on the property as a child with her sister and parents. Her father was in charge of the farm and had to bury some of the residents when they passed away. She has written down her recollections which are quite clear and vivid. Is there a program for recording oral histories? She speaks very well.

I am so interested in your comment that the information that you have is outdated but that there were a few markers. Would you have a plot map of the cemetery? And any photos? There doesn't seem to be any rhyme or reason to the plots and where people are buried.

Our plans are to erect a memorial containing the names of those buried there, four corner stones, a sign at the entrance, and some minor landscaping (there are a number of 100+ year old pine and cedar trees planted on the property that speak for themselves!). We would like to hold a dedication ceremony sometime this summer after all the work is completed. And then any preservation through a state program I will follow through with.

I really appreciate your time and efforts Amy. I visit a number of cemeteries down in Columbia County every May where my family members are buried. I really consider it so valuable to maintain the history. I am concerned about one of

Attached please find a scan of the cataloging description (also on file with the County Register of Deeds), and scans of two Certified Survey Maps of the cemetery and surrounding area. I double-checked our file but still found nothing relating to the locations of individual burials within the cemetery.

Following up on our conversation yesterday, I would like to thank you and your organization for helping to protect and preserve the cemetery. As a reminder, the cemetery is catalogued under Wisconsin's burial sites statute (Wis. Stats. 157.70). You will need to receive authorization from the Wisconsin Historical Society before conducting ground disturbance within the cemetery boundaries. It sounds like the only such disturbances you have planned involve installation of the memorial marker and perhaps the corner markers, depending on how they are placed. Given the time needed to turn around the authorization I would send in that request sooner rather than later.

I recommend emphasizing how marking the cemetery will help protect it in the future. Include a note of support from your County commission if you can. Even if you don't have precise plans regarding how large the memorial marker will be or where it will be placed, a sketch map showing the general idea will help.

If our staff decide that this isn't normal cemetery business, you will have to contact the Registry of Interested Persons for their comment. You'll be supplied with letters to send out to the appropriate members. I don't anticipate there will be any objections. After the comment period has passed you'll be given authorization, though perhaps with the caveat that an archaeologist qualified to work with human burials be on site when the base for the memorial is excavated (just in case).

I also forgot to mention yesterday that you can apply to the Registry of Interested Persons yourself to register an interest in Peaceful Rest. That way you'll be notified if any further disturbances are planned by other parties and you can comment on their proposals.

I will register as an Interested Person for the cemetery as will my friend who is working on this committee with me. We are focused on the Preservation and Historical part of the project. I will also get busy on the request to disturb a burial site form. I hope to get the committee to approve a survey tomorrow so that I can include that on a revised burial site registration form for you. Seeing the previous one I suspect that it was done in 1999 as that is when the county approved to construct a new health care facility (which is when they tore down the original Insane Asylum) and when they approved the construction of the truck driving school for Fox Valley Technical College. The roads for the truck driving school go around the east and south sides of the cemetery. To the west is the very large detention pond for the Town of Grand Chute and the north border of the cemetery is FVTC and the Truck Driving School.

You have been such a big help to me, I can't thank you enough. I appreciate your time with me on the phone and the time spent looking up documents and sending them to me. Thank you.

Attached please find a scan of the cataloging description (also on file with the County Register of Deeds), and scans of two Certified Survey Maps of the cemetery and surrounding area. I double-checked our file but still found nothing relating to the locations of individual burials within the cemetery.

Following up on our conversation yesterday, I would like to thank you and your organization for helping to protect and preserve the cemetery. As a reminder, the cemetery is catalogued under Wisconsin's burial sites statute (Wis. Stats. 157.70). You will need to receive authorization from the Wisconsin Historical Society before conducting ground disturbance within the cemetery boundaries. It sounds like the only such disturbances you have planned involve installation of the memorial marker and perhaps the corner markers, depending on how they are placed. Given the time needed to turn around the authorization I would send in that request sooner rather than later.

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Even if you don't have precise plans regarding how large the memorial marker will be or where it will be placed, a sketch map showing the general idea will help.

If our staff decide that this isn't normal cemetery business, you will have to contact the Registry of Interested Persons for their comment. You'll be supplied with letters to send out to the appropriate members. I don't anticipate there will be any objections. After the comment period has passed you'll be given authorization, though perhaps with the caveat that an archaeologist qualified to work with human burials be on site when the base for the memorial is excavated (just in case).

I also forgot to mention yesterday that you can apply to the Registry of Interested Persons yourself to register an interest in Peaceful Rest. That way you'll be notified if any further disturbances are planned by other parties and you can comment on their proposals.

Thank you for your response! I am thrilled to share with you the list of those who were buried at the Outagamie County Cemetery. I will also get out to take photos as soon as the snow is gone and send them to you as well.

I would be happy to update the form for you. And for your information, I will share with you our program document showing the proposed phases and the work we are planning to do. We have a committee meeting next week where I will share the program document with the committee. I need a few details from the rest of the committee to complete it.

I do want to ask for your advice. We are all concerned that in time when we are all gone or moved away, will the cemetery be taken care of. At the moment awareness has been raised about the cemetery being neglected and we are all concerned that it could happen again. I have looked over the documents for the Historical Site and wondered if we

Should pursue having it designated as a Registered Historical Site. Would that preserve it and would it be protected and maintained if we did that?

It is on Outagamie County land, and the county will always own the land.

Adjacent to it on the north and east lot line, and dangerously close, the Technical College has their truck driving school. The town of Grand Chute dug a large detention pond on the west side of the cemetery dangerously close too. The town does not want to maintain it. The county didn't maintain it. In 2007 when the cemetery made the news to repair it the Technical College said they would mow it. And they have done so since 2007.

I am just afraid that if the maintenance crew retires or leaves their job that it could fall into an overgrown weed bed as it was back before 2007.

So can you advise me as to what steps we as a committee should pursue to assure proper maintenance for its future? I am willing to work on any application process and follow through with the proper paperwork.

We also have a local resident who lived on the property as a child with her sister and parents. Her father was in charge of the farm and had to bury some of the residents when they passed away. She has written down her recollections which are quite clear and vivid. Is there a program for recording oral histories? She speaks very well.

I am so interested in your comment that the information that you have is outdated but that there were a few markers. Would you have a plot map of the cemetery? And any photos? There doesn't seem to be any rhyme or reason to the plots and where people are buried.

Our plans are to erect a memorial containing the names of those buried there, four corner stones, a sign at the entrance, and some minor landscaping (there are a number of 100+ year old pine and cedar trees planted on the property that speak for themselves!). We would like to hold a dedication ceremony sometime this summer after all the work is completed.

And then any preservation through a state program I will follow through with.

I really appreciate your time and efforts Amy. I visit a number of cemeteries down in Columbia County every May where my family members are buried. I really consider it so valuable to maintain the history. I am concerned about one of them as the church membership is dwindling and there won't be anyone left to take care of it. So I guess cemeteries are one of my passions in life!

I am attaching the two lists I composed of name of the people that are interred at the Cemetery here in Appleton. We have cross referenced the list with Brewster Village (which was once Outagamie County Health Care Center and before that the Outagamie County Insane Asylum) and with the Outagamie County Clerk's office. This lists matches both office's lists, however, there is some question as to whether we have all of the names so our committee decided to list a Jane Doe and a John Doe just to be sure that we have honored the memory of all those buried there. Unfortunately the records are elderly and handwritten so it is difficult to know for sure. The word document is an alphabetical list of the people with as much information as we have on them. The excel spreadsheet is a list of names, dates of death and plot numbers. It can be sorted by any of those columns, however, Excel doesn't recognize dates prior to 1900 so when you sort by dates of death those prior to 1900 will be at the bottom of the list.

I have begun working on the two forms for WHS. The priority is the Request to Disturb a Burial Site and the other will be an updated Report a Burial Site. We have the Technical School working on the site plan and diagram which I want for both forms for your office. Outagamie County is going to contract for a new survey to be completed which I will include in the updated Report a Burial Site form. We have a county supervisor who has joined our committee so we have communication directly with the county on this project.

I was under the belief that there had been permission granted to change the name of the cemetery from Outagamie County Insane Asylum Cemetery to Peaceful Rest. At the committee meeting last week our County Supervisor informed us that the request for a name change must pass through a committee and then must go to the entire county board for



Chip,

I spoke on the phone this morning with [REDACTED], who is working with a group to help restore the Outagamie County Poor Farm Cemetery (BOU-0122). You and I had chatted about the status of her request to disturb some time ago and you said that you had not yet seen the submittal. She called asking about the status this week and we were able to determine that the Request still hasn't been received and the project is not logged in. Since the original request was sent ca. August 1 and should have been here by now, she is going to re-submit. I gave her your name as the contact since the cemetery is catalogued.

This will be a separate request from case 14-0321, which involved remote sensing in the cemetery. The new request will revolve around excavation of a footing for a central memorial marker commemorating those buried in the cemetery, and I believe installation of a boundary fence. The graves are otherwise unmarked, and they are hoping the remote sensing conducted by Perigrine for 14-0321 will help them avoid burials in this new request to disturb. She is aware that the RIP will need to be notified and that some time will have to pass before they can begin ground disturbance.

Turn left at the intersection and follow that road which will lead south to the Agriculture Center. Turn left into the parking lot in front of the Agriculture Center.

**Once parked, walk to the driveway between the east end of the Agriculture Center and the cream-colored, steel fence and follow it south to the cemetery.**

The Dedication will last approximately 30 to 45 minutes. Please allow extra time for parking and walking to the cemetery.

**In case of inclement weather, the Dedication will take place in the Agriculture Center. Please use the east entrance to the building which is adjacent to the driveway. Enter the first door on your left.**
