#### PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION

AN ACT to amend 281.665 (1) (b) of the statutes; relating to: eligibility for municipal flood control grants (suggested as remedial legislation by the Department of Natural Resources).

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill adds counties and Indian tribes and bands to the list of local government entities eligible to receive grants under the municipal flood control program administered by the Department of Natural Resources.

Under the program under current law, DNR provides financial assistance to cities, villages, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts for facilities and structures for the collection and transmission of storm water and groundwater and for floodproofing public and private structures in the 100-year floodplain.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Law Revision Committee Prefatory Note: This bill is a remedial legislation proposal, requested by the Department of Natural Resources and introduced by the Law Revision Committee under s. 13.83 (1) (c) 4. and 5., stats. After careful consideration of the various provisions of the bill, the Law Revision Committee has determined that this bill makes minor substantive changes in the statutes, and that these changes are desirable as a matter of public policy.

#### SECTION 1

Section 1	. 281.0	665(1)	(b)	of the	statutes	is	amended	to	read:

- 2 281.665 (1) (b) "Local governmental unit" means a <u>county</u>, city, village, town
- 3 or, metropolitan sewerage district, or federally recognized Indian tribe or band
- 4 <u>located in this state</u>.

Note: This Section allows counties and federally recognized Indian tribes or bands to receive municipal flood control grants. Currently, such grants may be received by cities, villages, towns, and metropolitan sewerage districts.
