2021-23 Biennial Budget Request



Investment will allow 2,000 additional individuals each year to earn a short-term credential in healthcare, protective services, manufacturing, IT and other essential sectors.

Outcomes-Based Funding



State law requires WTCS to maintain a distinct formula for allocating a portion of general state aid to technical colleges, linking outcomes to investments.

English Language Learning (ELL) Programs



Adults with limited English skills primarily work in low-wage jobs



ELL programs that blend communication skills with job training can increase employment and earnings



In Wisconsin, 8.7% of citizens are speakers of a non-English language (Spanish and Hmong)



Adult Education and Beyond



Since 2017, 11 of the 16 technical colleges provided education services to 25 of 37 state prisons, annually awarding more than 30,300 credits to over 6,00 individuals



Since 2019, over 2,600 Justice – Involved Students Completed a Financial Literacy or Employability Skill Course



Since 2019, over 5,500 Justice – Involved Students were enrolled in WTCS courses, and over 110 students Attained a GED/HSED



Impact of Education



For every \$1 invested in prison education, taxpayers save \$4-\$5 in re-incarceration costs during the first three years post-release with a 40-50% decrease in recidivism rates



Increased and improved employment opportunities; reentry is far smoother and more successful for those who took classes in prison, Median salaries for associate degree grads: \$50,000



Fewer infractions than incarcerated people who were not enrolled; breaks down racial and ethnic barriers, attributing to tension and violence, significantly improve relations between staff and the incarcerated; enhances the prisoners' self-esteem



Success through 2nd
Chance Pell

Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) was one of 67 colleges chosen for the U.S. Department of Education's Second Chance Pell Pilot program, which provided Pell Grants to eligible prisoners.

Graduated over one hundred students from their AA/AS programs; Over 90% of Welding Fundamentals and CNC graduates were gainfully employed in those career paths; Over 85% of Second Chance Pell (SCP) students have a GPA of 3.75 or higher; had near-perfect attendance; much higher course/program completion rates than traditional students
