I don't think there's an issue as long as credential holders of the Intermediate Clinical Supervisor credential are grandfathered into the Independent Clinical Supervisor credential (I'm one of them). To the best of my knowledge, these two credentials are combined in SPS 161.05.

I was looking at the SAC Certification Review Committee meeting minutes from 5/1/17, and the elimination of the credential was recommended at that time. Peter Fabian, who was a MFT representative on the MPSW Board when I was serving t that time was part of the SAC Cert review committee, and agreed with the recommendation to eliminate the credential then (see the attached document). He was approving the applications for the MPSW 1.09 specialty credential and passed it onto me when I joined the board. And of course, that credential no longer applies to an LCSW credential holder.

I'm not sure if this helps.
