## PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION

1 AN ACT *to create* 118.335 of the statutes; **relating to:** pupils wearing traditional

tribal regalia at a high school graduation ceremony.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill explicitly prohibits school boards and charter schools from prohibiting a pupil who is a member of, or eligible to be enrolled in, a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state from wearing traditional tribal regalia at a high school graduation ceremony. For purposes of this prohibition, "tribal regalia" means the traditional dress or recognized objects of religious or cultural significance, including symbols, beads, and feathers, of a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

## SECTION 1

1	(a) "Traditional tribal regalia" means a tribe's traditional dress or recognized
2	objects of religious or cultural significance, including tribal symbols, beads, and
3	feathers.
4	(b) "Tribe" means a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this
5	state.
6	(2) No school board or charter school may prohibit a pupil who is a member of
7	a tribe or who is eligible to be enrolled as a member of a tribe from wearing traditional
8	tribal regalia at a high school graduation ceremony.
