

HIGHLIGHTS OF EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME IN WISCONSIN

Labor Force — An average of about 2,807,300 workers were employed in Wisconsin in 2010. Another 255,300 were part of the available workforce but were unemployed, resulting in an average unemployment rate of 8.3% for 2010. Since 1970, Wisconsin's labor force has increased by over 1.1 million workers from 1,941,700 to 3,062,600 in 2010. Based on January figures, the state's highest unemployment rate for that period occurred in 1983 when it reached 11.7%.

Employment by Industry — An average of 2.74 million Wisconsin workers were engaged in nonfarm employment in 2010. The greatest number worked in trade, transportation, and utilities (508,300); and manufacturing (430,600).

Nationally, 130.9 million were employed in nonfarm work in 2009. Trade, transportations, and utilities, with 25 million workers; and government, with 22.5 million, were the largest segments.

In March 2008, manufacturing and retail trade together accounted for approximately one-third of the number of employees in Wisconsin. The majority (84.3%) of the 144,081 business establishments in the state had fewer than 20 employees in March 2008. Manufacturing accounted for the greatest number of large-sized firms, 395 out of 1,181 establishments with 250 or more employees.

Income by Industry — Earned income, which consists of wages and salaries, labor income, and proprietor's income, totaled \$154.9 billion in Wisconsin in 2010. Service industries provided the greatest percentage of Wisconsin's earned income during that year, about 33.5%, with manufacturing at 19.4%. Government (all levels) and government enterprises were third at 15%.

Personal Income — Personal income in Wisconsin totaled \$219 billion in 2010. Wisconsin's per capita personal income of \$38,432 lags behind the national average of \$40,584, ranking Wisconsin 28th among the states. Connecticut had the highest per capita personal income (\$56,001 in 2010, or about 138% of the national average). Mississippi had the lowest per capita personal income in 2010 at \$31,186, about 76.8% of the national average.

Wisconsin's total adjusted gross income (total income reported for tax purposes) in 2009 was about \$132 billion, or \$45,372 per tax return. Ozaukee County had the highest per return AGI in 2009 at \$79,263, followed by Waukesha County at \$68,711. Eau Claire County is third (\$60,252), and St. Croix County is fourth (\$56,188). Rusk County (\$29,034), Forest County (\$28,201), and Menominee County (\$14,881) had the lowest per return adjusted gross incomes.

Unemployment Benefits — In an average month in 2010, Wisconsin reported that 122,900 persons (about 48% of the 255,300 unemployed) received unemployment compensation. Nationally, 4.6 million people, or 31% of the 14.8 million unemployed, received benefits during an average month. The average weekly benefit in Wisconsin was \$274.94, less than the national average of \$299.33. The highest average weekly benefit of \$416.32 was paid in Hawaii, followed by New Jersey (\$397.41), and Massachusetts (\$391.80). Lowest in the nation were Louisiana (\$208.90), Alabama (\$205.80), and Mississippi (\$189.99).
