

HIGHLIGHTS OF LOCAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT IN WISCONSIN

Employment and Earnings — In March 2009, Wisconsin ranked 21st among the states in full-time equivalent (FTE) state and local government employees with 284,963. The State of Wisconsin employed 70,457 workers, while local government employed 214,506.

In March 2009, Wisconsin ranked 19th in average total payroll for state and local government employees with \$1,177,779,297. California ranked first with a payroll of \$10,075,427,572 and North Dakota ranked 50th with \$148,586,189.

Units of Local Government — As of April 1, 2010, Wisconsin had 1,923 general units of local government – 72 counties, 190 cities, 404 villages, and 1,257 towns.

Counties varied in 2010 population from Milwaukee at 947,735 to Menominee with 4,232. These two counties were also highest and lowest in 2009 full value property assessments at \$66.8 billion and \$318.2 million, respectively. As determined by the U.S. Census Bureau in 2000, Marathon County is the largest in land area with 1,545 square miles and Ozaukee County the smallest with 232 square miles.

Based on the 2010 Census, Wisconsin’s city residents totaled 3,150,339 in 2010, a 5.2% increase from the 2000 Census; village population was 869,587, a 26.6% increase; and town population was 1,667,060, a 0.1% decrease. As of April 1, 2010, a total of 92 Wisconsin municipalities had populations of 10,000 or more. The City of Milwaukee ranked first at 594,833, and the City of Elkhorn, with 10,084 residents, was smallest in the group.

Administration — Wisconsin cities may adopt a mayor, manager, or commission form of government. Of 190 cities, 10 have a city manager and 180 have a mayor. Currently, no city uses the commission form of government. Villages may use a president or manager form of government. Of 404 villages, only 10 have an appointed manager. Currently, 93 cities and 97 villages employ an administrator in a full-time or combined position.

Each county board is headed by a chairperson chosen by the board. In addition, 13 counties have an elected county executive, 24 have an appointed county administrator, and 33 have an appointed administrative coordinator.
