

## HIGHLIGHTS OF LOCAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT IN WISCONSIN

**Employment and Earnings** — In December 2014, Wisconsin ranked 23rd among the states in full-time equivalent (FTE) state and local government employees with 274,394. The State of Wisconsin employed 72,347 workers, while local government employed 202,047.

In December 2014, Wisconsin ranked 18th in average total payroll for state and local government employees with \$1,196,817,811. California ranked first with a payroll of \$10,024,497,989 and South Dakota ranked 50th with \$158,302,785.

**Units of Local Government** — As of October 2014, Wisconsin had 1,924 general units of local government – 72 counties, 190 cities, 407 villages, and 1,255 towns.

In 2014, counties varied in official population estimates from Milwaukee at 949,741 to Menominee with 4,236. These two counties were also highest and lowest in 2013 full value property assessments at \$57 billion and \$288 million, respectively. As determined by the U.S. Census Bureau in 2010, Marathon County is the largest in land area with 1,545 square miles and Pepin County the smallest with 232 square miles.

Based on the 2010 Census, Wisconsin's city residents totaled 3,150,339 in 2010, a 5.2% increase from the 2000 Census; village population was 869,587, a 26.6% increase; and town population was 1,667,060, a 0.1% decrease. As of April 1, 2010, a total of 92 Wisconsin municipalities had populations of 10,000 or more. The City of Milwaukee ranked first at 594,833, and the City of Elkhorn, with 10,084 residents, was smallest in the group.

**Administration** — Wisconsin cities may adopt a mayor, manager, or commission form of government. Of 190 cities, 10 have a city manager and 180 have a mayor. Currently, no city uses the commission form of government. Villages may use a president or manager form of government. Of 407 villages, only 9 have an appointed manager. Currently, 76 cities and 77 villages employ an administrator in a full-time or combined position.

Each county board is headed by a chairperson chosen by the board. In addition, 11 counties have an elected county executive, 25 have an appointed county administrator, 32 have an appointed administrative coordinator, 3 have a corporation counsel, and one has a county manager.
